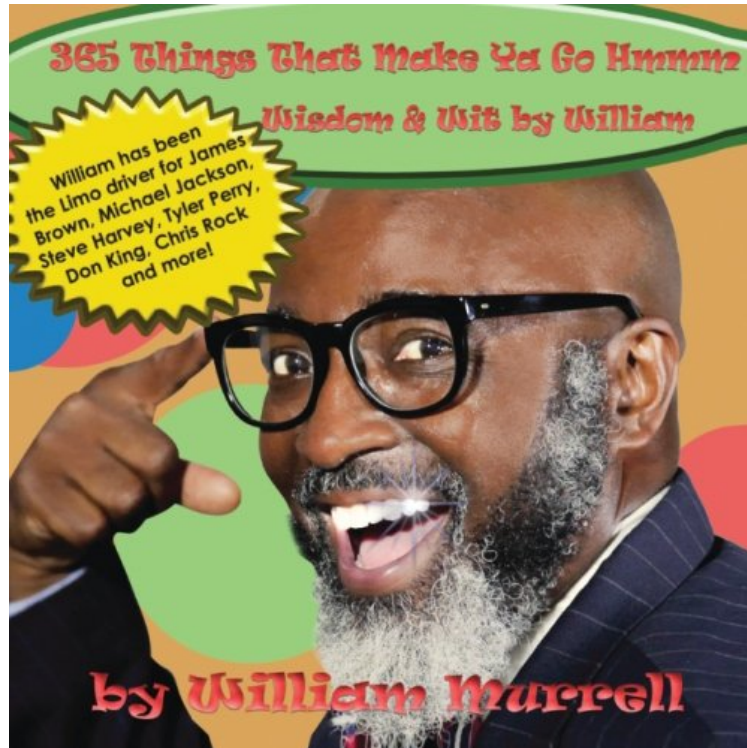

Sayings from the Front SeatBy Silver Screen VideosNOTE: The publisher graciously provided me with a copy of this book and requested that I write a review.According to his biography, William Murrell is the "limo driver to the stars," a man who chauffeured around many of the most famous names in sports and entertainment during his career, including James Brown, Michael Jackson, Chris Rock, Al Sharpton, and many others. Over the years, he apparently drove with his eyes on the road and his ears in the back seat, since he accumulated a lot of interesting anecdotes and aphorisms. In "365 Things That Make Ya Go Hmmm," he shares a large number of them with readers.The bulk of the book consists of 365 sayings and musings, most of them one or two lines long. Some of them could have (and probably did) originate from old vaudeville comedy routines, while others resemble the sayings that people pass around to their friends and contacts on Facebook and LinkedIn every day. Murrell freely admits many of these sayings originated with some of the illustrious passengers he's carried over the years. Other sayings, most of which are concentrated towards the end of the book, are somewhat longer and more serious in nature, reflecting Murrell's philosophy of life. The man who emerges from these passages is a loving, caring, upbeat but realistic person

and not merely a conduit for one-liners. Obviously, considering the origin of many of these sayings, some will be very familiar to readers, and others are slight rewordings of old chestnuts. Still, a good number of them are refreshingly new and quite witty or thought provoking or both. I Googled a few of them at random and found several that appeared very few times, if at all. So, even people who spend a lot of their time accumulating and forwarding similar tidbits will probably find a number of sayings in "365 Things" that they aren't all that familiar with. There's a few clunkers and a couple I flat out never got, but I'd guess that about two-thirds of the sayings in this book will come across as relatively fresh to most people, and many of the rest, even if somewhat familiar, are still entertaining. For a man who's known so many famous names, Murrell avoids naming them for the most part in "365 Things." He does include one terrific anecdote at the very beginning of the book about Michael Jackson paying his respects to James Brown after the latter's death (Murrell actually drove Brown on the day he died). Having read this particular tale, I wish Murrell had passed on more stories like it, but this one anecdote is a solid bonus for readers. It's undoubtedly no coincidence that "365 Things" has precisely that number of observations, since the book resembles the types of calendars that get exchanged with regularity as office Christmas presents. The calendar format pretty much requires readers to limit themselves to one observation a day, while it's much easier for readers to plow through this book a lot more quickly if they're tempted (and they'll likely be tempted to "just read one more"). Fortunately, it's the type of book that has good repeat value. Read it, and pull it out after a few months and re-read it, and a lot of it is still refreshing. Frankly, there's a few sayings in this book people would be well advised to keep handy and use as guidelines for their life. At \$8.95, "365 Things" does carry a fairly hefty price tag for a book with relatively little actual material. Like joke books, there's one saying per page, many of them one-liners. Further, this is the type of book that simply won't appeal to some people, those who don't like reading about someone who boils his philosophy of life down to a few sentences. However, in its favor, I would say that "365 Things" is a book that invites a slow reading and holds up well on re-reading, as well as making a good holiday present. Those who read it will be glad William Murrell chose to pass his 365 bits of wisdom along.
