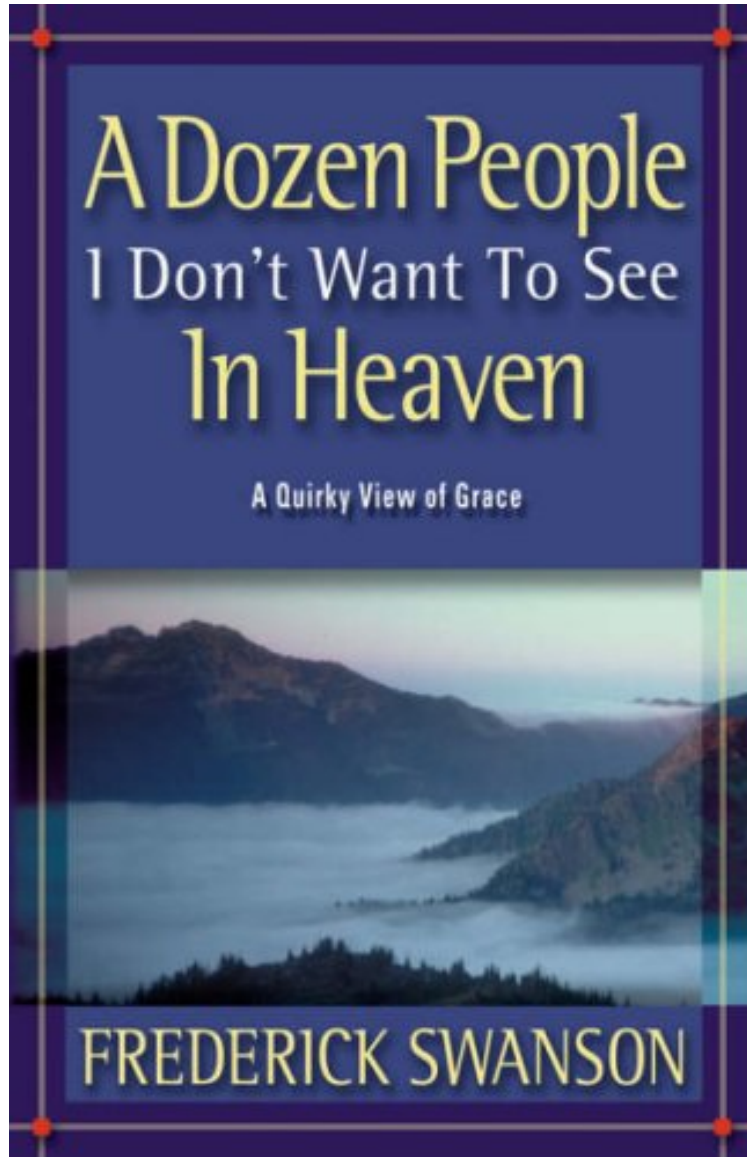

Are you a long-time Christian? Are you overly critical of others? Growing up in an evangelical church in the 1950's created the foundation for my faith. But the experience, or should I say, "the times", established an unfortunate mindset: a most restrictive world view. Buttressed by an unequivocal sense of right and wrong, good and evil, saved and not saved, a critical spirit developed and grew in me. Throughout life I have battled against judging others, especially those I encounter in the evangelical community. The book contains twelve personalities that rubbed me "the wrong way."
