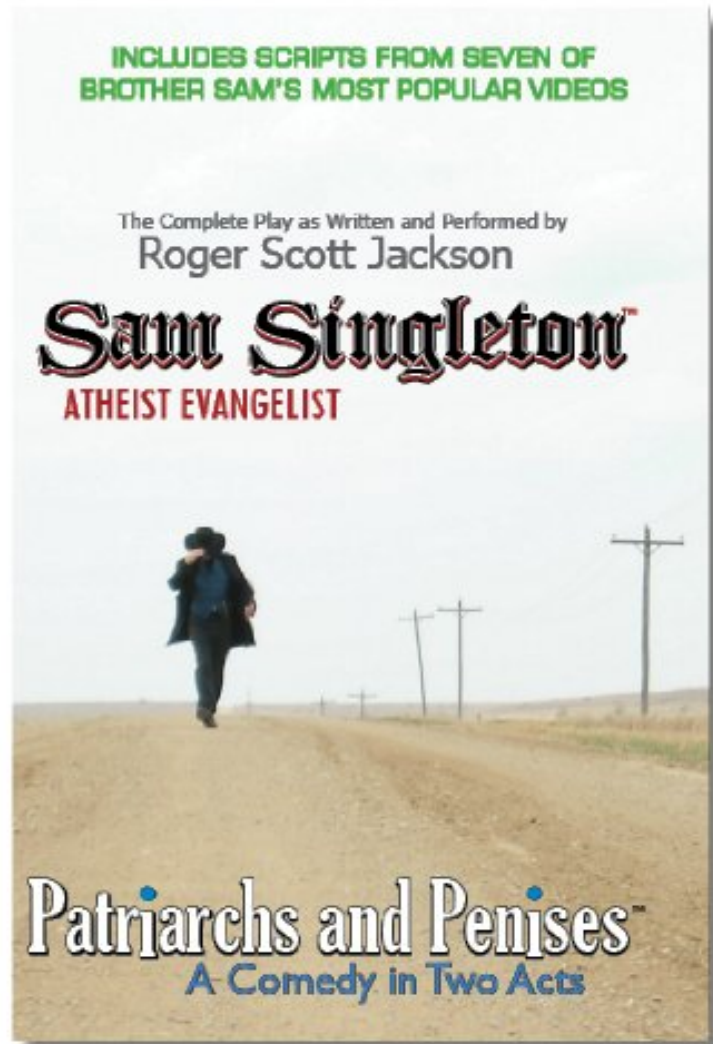

There's lots of ground covered besides the gutter-humor; with Brother Sam utterly filleting God's apparent jealousy issues as well as calling out Christians for interpreting the Bible literally. From the beginning - Sam makes clear his intention to make his work accessible to the Godless, the Godly and the agnostics...and he does a fine job of each.
