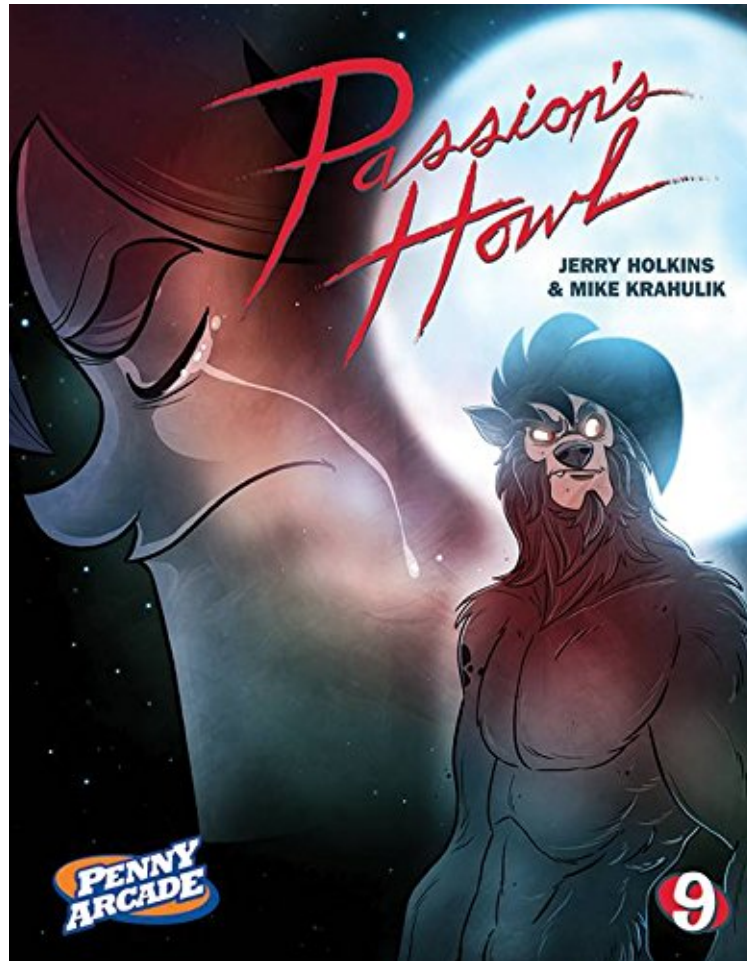

So many memories ...Penny Arcade is free online and you don't have to buy the book, and I would strongly suggest you look at the site to get a feel for what it's all about. The primary area of topics are games, the game industry and technology, though social commentary and things that are going on in their lives occasionally feature too.As I already said, I love every strip and so it's hard for me to rate these books, I know the content already I read it as it comes out. I loved the content (the strips) and there is no surprise there. There are short snippets of text that accompany every strip and mostly I don't read them unless I can't work out what the strip was about. The quality of the book is great, with tough-ish exterior. There were a couple of strips that were printed badly, one had smudging and another had a dirty page. Nothing dramatic, and sadly common in full colour prints. Overall I wouldn't say that diminished the overall product significantly though.
