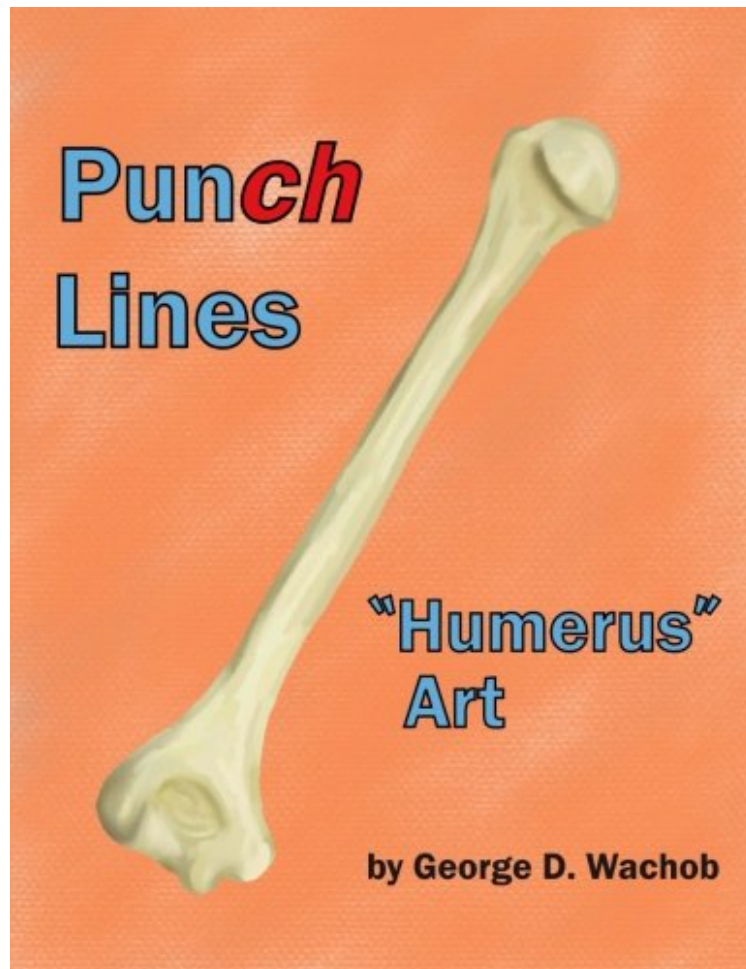

They were "groan-worthy" as promised, but not in a groan-so-good kinda way.Most of these made no sense, or I would have given at least one more star for effort. Or perhaps if the illustrations had been better (very clip-art). Many of these made no sense even with the answer key, and far too many were a stretch to fit rather than an actual pun -- either the answer OR the picture chosen to represent it. The ones I did get were the obvious ones. And, as mentioned, I'm really into puns.I'll give this to my pun-loving daughter and see if

she feels differently, but I was, sadly, underwhelmed.EDITED TO ADD: My 13 yo loved it, so it was a winner there.

Laughter is said to be the best medicine. If there is one thing that the new book *Punch Lines: "Humerus"* Art by George Wachob is meant to do, it is to make you laugh. Regardless of whether or not you think that it will be good for your health, *Punch Lines* will certainly lighten your mood and bring a smile to your face. This book contains 60 unique pun art pictures and punch lines (titles). The layout allows you to try to discover the name of each drawing before you actually see the title. Some puns are a little easier to guess while others require a more "furrowed brow" approach (and maybe a somewhat more twisted sense of humor). Even young children who can't read enjoy the humorous art and often come up with titles that can be just as funny as those intended by the author. Our test subjects gave this book a "Groan Index" of 9.5 out of 10. Random, hysterical outbursts of laughter were also noted from a number of readers. For these reasons, it is recommended that you do not view this book in a public library.

About the AuthorGeorge Wachob is a naturalist at heart, but his art seems anything but natural. His unique point of view shines through everything he creates. His wife, Susan, has had to endure his sometimes over the top sense of humor for the past 39 years, but she still remains his greatest and most loyal fan.
