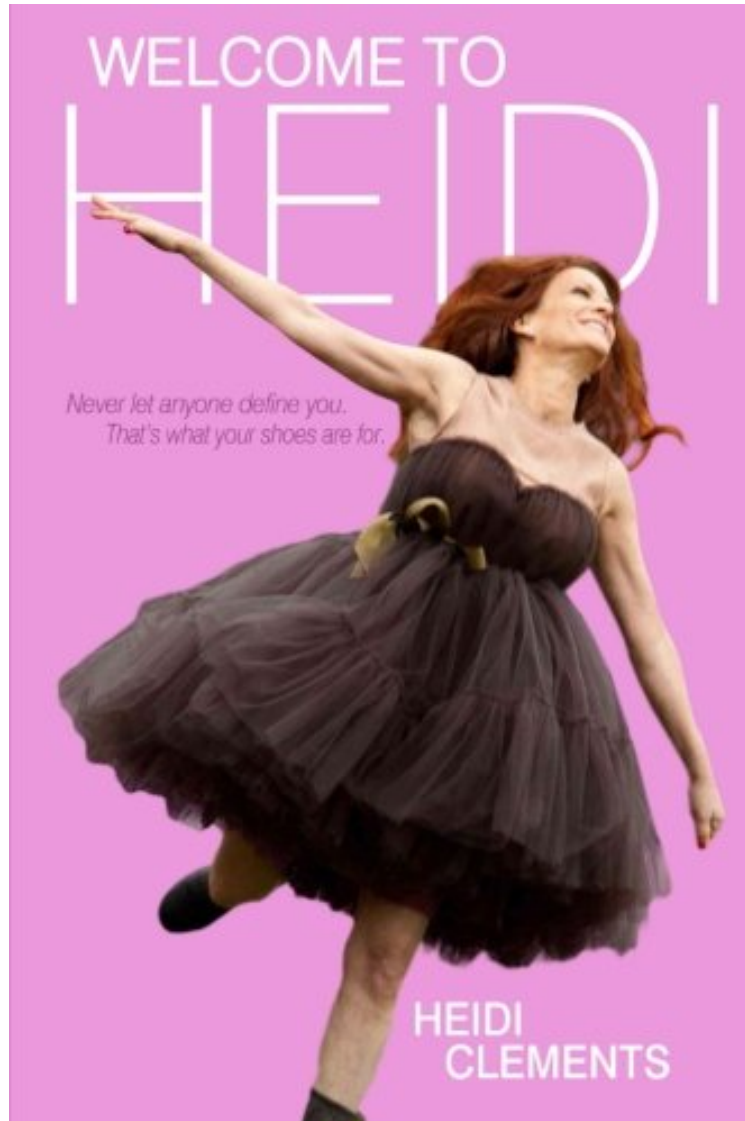

No, the true genius of "Welcome To Heidi" is, amid the rants and bloodletting personal introspection, there are incredibly poignant life lessons to take away from what, on the surface, feels like a raucous romp through show business and life business. Heidi reminds us how wonderfully flawed we all are, and avoids any moments which could be interpreted as a humble brag. Quite the opposite; she obliterates the sacred, peels back the facades to get at her composite of the truth. And entertaining? Heidi, run don't walk to a keyboard and put together a followup compendium. I won't throw down a spoiler here, but "Welcome To Heidi" is filled with snort-worthy words and phrases from the wonderfully twisted mind of the author. She manages to take two disparate words, mashes them up, to create a new word or Heidi-ism. These gems are sprinkled about the book and deserve a kind of urban dictionary of their own--like the dictionary according to Heidi. It could spawn a new drinking game.
