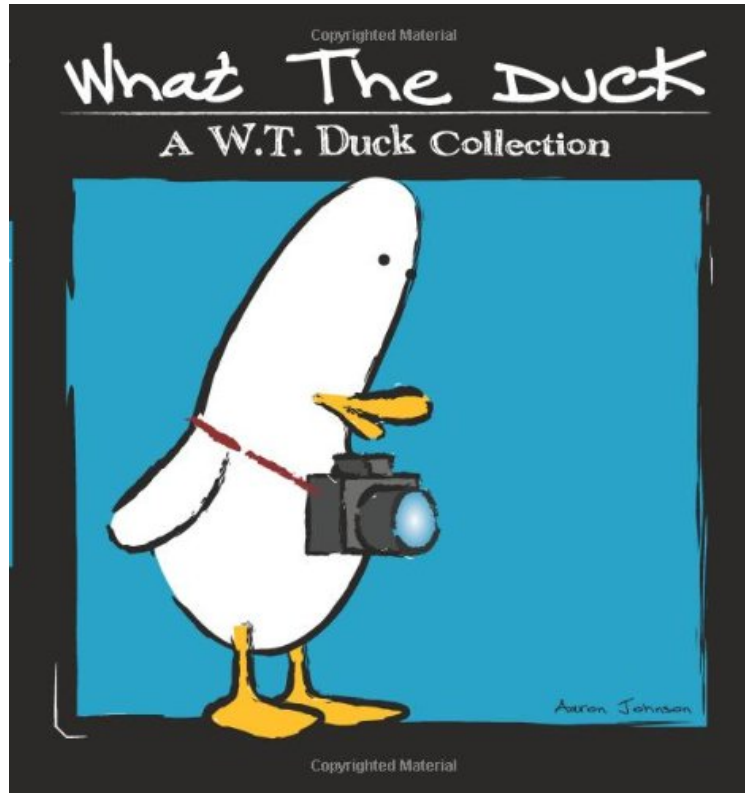

It gave this reader a chance to catch up on all if the original WTD cartoon strips that were missed from before, and in the frequently used three-panel illustrations, we meet all of the regular characters still found today in this clever and also sometimes sarcastic strip. We also meet the heroic, the romantic and the idiotic. We find what the camera sees, what the photographer sees, and what the subject sees. We even find what the lens cap sees.
